ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES

WSCC provides programming in education, workforce development and financial literacy. The Employment Program services include resume and interview practice, mentoring, iob search assistance and more. The Adult **Education Program** assists clients in acquiring their GED and learning to better understand documents that affect daily life. Financial Literacy assists clients with opening a bank account, creating budgets and saving.

FAMILY SERVICES

Family Services provides activities, therapies and counseling based on a family approach to intervention. Children experiencing homelessness are at risk for emotional, social, behavioral and educational concerns. Staff members assess each child who comes into Moriah House or Zacchaeus and work to teach both mother and child to understand their relationship and build on their strengths. Family Services programming ensures families have food and school supplies.

Moriah House

A women and children's shelter that provides a safe and nurturing place to live and meals and life's other basic needs. The women in Moriah House are challenged with issues of economic hardship, trauma, chemical dependency, mental illness, lack of education or lack of employment. Moriah House enables each woman to develop her individualized plan for permanent housing, stable income, selfsufficiency, family skills and education/training.

Provided 23,356 instances of service from Street Survival and **Outreach and Advocacy** programs of the Resource Center.

Served 5.857 people in the Clothing and **Household Distribution** program in the Resource Center.

Provided **89.528** nutritious meals to clients in the Resource Center and Moriah House.



Provided services to 354 children in the Family Services Program.

The Family Services Program provided 25 children with weekend meals during the Summer Backpack Program.

Provided rent subsidy and educated 90 families to be responsible tenants in Zacchaeus Housing Solutions.

Saw 108 adults benefit from case management services in Moriah House and Zacchaeus Housing Solutions.

Provided **11.083** nights of lodging to families in Moriah House.



Assisted 92 clients in finding sustainable employment in the **Employment Program.**

Educated 92 clients in the Adult Education and Financial Literacy programs.
